Its set in a beautiful, safe community, is an approx. 5 min drive from school (you save a ton on gas), and the rent prices are competitive for the quality of apartment you receive. The apartments were built about 3 years ago; so many apartments are brand new for the renter (a lot of people just moved in recently, so if an available apartment isn't brand new, most likely, one person leased the apartment before you). I'd suggest living in a 2 bedroom apt with a roommate- it saves you a lot more money. There are 1 and 2 bedrooms apartments available; the one bedroom go from \$825 and up, and the 2 bedrooms run from \$1159 and up. As far as cons are concerned, my only complaint would be that the walls are thin enough for you to hear the person either above or below you, or at times, someone yelling. I have experienced a

few loud arguments, and the people above me have a dog, so I can hear the dog running around and barking at times. The solution to this is either to try to get an apartment on the 4th floor (top floor) to minimize overhead noise, or to get earplugs for times when there are issues that you might be able to avoid (i.e. someone stomping for a few seconds). Also, before your move, you can check in with the office to see if the person above you owns a pet. Despite the noise issues, however, the front desk is very good at dealing with complaints. If there is loud music, arguments, or noises that are unacceptable, you can call the front desk or the courtesy officer (outside business hours) and they will go to the door of the suspected noise, or look around to find where the noise is coming from, and/or call the person making the noise and ask them to turn down the volume. Offenders are penalized with warnings, leading up to an eviction status, so if you like to make noise this may not be for the place for you!

Cons: However, noise issues have never been aggravating enough for me to not want to live in my apartment. Staff is just as concerned about eliminating noise as you are, and they are very active in eliminating those issues.

Again, contact me if you're considering this place, if you'd like further information, or would

Currently I reside at Cascades townhomes. They're mostly 2 story homes. The basic town home is 2-3 bedrooms, 2.5 baths (master bedroom has shower, tub, and walk-in closet). Kitchen, dining area, den, breakfast bar, hardwood floors, carpet. The larger homes have a separate dining room, 3-6 bedrooms, a garage and a patio or deck. There are homes for sale and some for rent as well. Gated community- (CAVEAT: where-ever you are looking to live don't let the gate be the ultimate factor...a gate is a deterrent but does not guarantee of "maximum safety"...also you have to consider why the location needs a gate in the first place. It could be an indication of an unsafe location. I've lived in gated and non-gated communities and the gate was not the determinant of my safety. FYI). I've felt safe for the most part, there have been a few break-ins and car thefts however with proper

safety precaution measures (i.e. don't leave unoccupied vehicle running with the driver's door open while you run inside to get something, and always lock your front door and turn on the alarm system). I've lived here over a year and have not experienced personal theft or anything of that nature. It's a pretty quiet area. There is a community pool with a club house that can be rented, an outdoor BBQ area, basketball court, tennis court, Dog Park, and a local outdoor track. It's about 15min from campus where I-285 and I20 meet (near Cascades skating rink...yes the exact same one that's in the movie ATL :-)
